Program Name: Undergraduate certificate in Cosmetology/Cosmetologist, General

Program Length: 31 weeks (full-time)

Program Costs: \$14,250 for tuition and fees; \$1,052 for books and supplies

Students Borrowing Money:

Of the students who complete this program within normal time, the typical graduate leaves with \$7,467 of debt. (The median cumulative amount of debt including private, institutional, and Federal student loans.)

The typical monthly payment for this amount of student loans with an interest rate of 5.05% is approximately \$79. (The median monthly loan payment for students who completed the program, if it were repaid over 10 years.)

Debt-to-Earnings Ratio:

This program has passed standards established by the U.S. Department of Education that are based on the amounts students borrow for enrollment and their reported earnings. If in the future the program does not pass the standards, students who are then enrolled may not be able to use federal student grants or loans to pay for the program, and may have to find other ways, such as private loans, to pay for the program.

Students Graduating "On Time": 34% of Title IV federal student aid recipients completed the program within 31 weeks. (The share of students who completed within 100% of normal time.)

Graduates Who Got Jobs: 65% of students that graduated in 2017 reported employment in a cosmetology-related industry/profession. (The minimum standards for outcomes, as defined by the National Accrediting Commission of Career Arts and Sciences, are: Completion – 50%, Licensure – 70%, and Placement – 60%.)

Licensure Requirements: This program meets licensure requirements in Massachusetts and Connecticut. The program does not meet licensure requirements in Vermont, New Hampshire, Rhode Island or New York. (Some states require students to graduate from a state-approved program in order to obtain a license to practice the profession in those states.)
